The School

Robinson Township Christian School is a private Christian elementary, middle, and high school with a four-year college preparatory program. Founded in 1978 by members of Providence Presbyterian Church and Grace Orthodox Presbyterian Church, the School has a total enrollment in 2005-2006 of 134 students in grades PK-12, with 28 students in grades 9-12.

Mission

The mission of Robinson Township Christian School is to provide a Christ-centered education in which students are motivated to seek wisdom and knowledge and to develop a Christian character and witness so that they may faithfully fulfill their calling in life to the Glory of God.

Professional Certification and Associations

The School is a certified, non-public school authorized by The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to provide daily instruction. The School is involved in a formal process of continuous school improvement under the auspices of The Association of Christian Schools International. The School is a member of Christian Schools International.

Faculty and Class Size

The teachers of Robinson Township Christian School are PA certified, working towards certification, or have acquired a master's degree. The average teaching experience is 6 years with master teachers averaging 14 years of experience. The average class size is 10.
